

The Map: Mount Diablo, Los Vaqueros & Surrounding Parks Featuring the Diablo Trail



This map shows what Save Mount Diablo and its allies (notable the California State Park System and the East Bay Regional Park District) have been able to accomplish in the past 36 years. With your continued encouragement and support, preserved lands have increase from 6,788 acres in one park in 1971 to over 90,000 acres in 38 parks in 2008.

The map also shows the challenge that lies before us: nearly 90,000 acres are still in private hands. The protected lands form a large doughnut of public open space at the center of the East Bay. *But half of the mountain remains threatened, including the doughnut hole.* If we don't preserve an additional 90,000 acres we'll lose the heart of the mountain and what we have already preserved will be damaged.

The research and design for the Mount Diablo Trail Map was accomplished by our volunteer Map Committee. The printing cost were funded by a grant from REI.

Our volunteer map committee walked hundreds of miles of trails with GPS units and worked for more then two years to create it. In addition to assembling all of the Diablo parks and trails for the first time, this is also the most accurate Diablo map ever created.

Your support allows us to be successful in our continued efforts to save Mount Diablo.
